The Public Safety bond measure on the ballot this November would raise the full \$16.5 million needed to replace the current Safety Center.

Supervisor Delgaudio has also pushed to approve a design for the new Sterling Safety Center that preserves the park on the corner and all of its trees fully intact.

BOND ON NOVEMBER 4TH BALLOT TO RENOVATE STERLING COMMUNITY CENTER

The bonds on the ballot this November include more than just a replacement for the Sterling Safety Center – the Parks, Recreation and Library Projects bond would also provide \$6.1 million to help fund the renovation of the Sterling Community Center and \$4.85 million for the nearby relocation of the Sterling Library.

The Sterling Community Center on Enterprise St. is nestled right in the heart of Sterling Park. It hosts a wide variety of community events, including theater performances by the Sterling Playmakers, summer camps, birthday parties, vol-

leyball games, moonbouncing, kids’ nights, and many other family-friendly activities.

The Sterling Community Center is in such high demand that it is looking to expand into the space currently occupied by the Sterling Library.

“This bond would launch one of the biggest community development projects in the history of Sterling,” explained Supervisor Delgaudio, “I’ve worked hard to put this bond into the hands of the people, to give people a say in the future of our community, and I trust the people of Sterling to do the right thing.” -TDR
